Suflave Instructions

ONE (1) DAY BEFORE THE PROCEDURE: NO SOLID FOOD!

From the time you wake up, you may have <u>clear liquids only</u> from the following list: Water, Gatorade, Propel, flavored water, white cranberry juice, white grape juice, apple juice, Kool-Aid, Crystal Light, any type of soda, tea, black coffee (no milk, cream including, non-dairy), clear broths (chicken, beef or vegetable), and Popsicles, Ensure clear. **Avoid anything with red or purple dyes**. **Avoid green leafy vegetables, nuts, and seeds 4-5 days prior to your procedure.**

Diabetic patients need to follow a sugar-free, clear liquid diet. **DO NOT TAKE YOUR MEDICATION THE MORNING OF YOUR PROCEDURE**.

You may take all your medications today as usual, unless instructed otherwise.

If you are on GLP-1 medications, you must stop these ONE WEEK prior to your procedure.

5:00 PM Add 1 flavor enhancing packet into the provided bottle. Fill the provided bottle with water up to the fill line. After capping the bottle, gently shake the bottle until all the powder has dissolved. Drink 8 ounces every 15 minutes until the bottle is empty. Then, drink an additional 16 ounces of just water/Gatorade.

9:00 PM drink the second bottle of SUFLAVE (repeating steps above). You must drink BOTH bottles for a complete prep.

Stop clear liquids after midnight unless you are scheduled after 12:00PM. If your procedure is after 12 PM, you may have clear liquids until .

DAY OF PROCEDURE:

You cannot work or drive following the procedure. You must have a ride home; taxis are not allowed. If you take heart medication, blood pressure, anti-seizure, or breathing medications in the morning, take them with enough water to swallow the medicine at least 4 hours prior to procedure time. Hold <u>ALL</u> other medications until you return home.
